The controversy over slavery only worsened as new territories and states were admitted to the union. Supporters of slavery saw an opportunity to create more slave states.

California enters the Union as a free state, a more effective Fugitive Slave Law is passed, New Mexico and Utah will decide the issue of slavery by popular sovereignty, Texas receives \$10 million to surrender its claims to New Mexico, the sale of slaves is banned in the District of Columbia, but slaves are not illegal there.
