A half-century later, in 2000, life expectancy at age 65 had climbed to 17.6 additional years (19 for women, 16 for men). By 2018, it increased again, adding 19.5 years (20.7 for women, 18.1 for men).

Results appeared to show that CVD mortality might be reduced in men when unfavorable psychosocial working conditions are improved for manual workers (PAF = 7.7%, 95% CI: 6.5-10.0). The upward-leveling scenario seems to reduce CVD mortality inequalities for manual workers, by 13-74%.

"Living in a country with gender equality benefits men's health, producing, for example, lower mortality rates, higher well-being, half the chance of being depressed, a higher likelihood of having protected sex, lower suicide rates, and a 40% reduced risk of violent death," the authors wrote in a report summary.

Under 75s mortality rate from cardiovascular diseases. Cardiovascular disease (CVD) is one of the major causes of premature death (i.e. under the age of 75 years) in England. In 2015-17, the rate of premature CVD mortality in NE was the second highest of all the English regions and significantly higher than the national rate.

Low SES is associated with increased mortality in older Australian men and health-related behaviours accounted for less than one-fourth of these associations. Further research is needed to fully understand the mechanisms underlying SES inequalities in mortality among older people.

Consequently, income-based inequality in mortality rates increased by 32% among men and 87% among women over this period, in relative terms. The recent trend of increasing health inequality may exist even in countries like Sweden with good welfare provision.

Still, in this last decade, the absolute inequalities in cause-specific mortality among men were mostly due to cardiovascular diseases (CVD) (34% of total mortality inequality), lung cancer and respiratory diseases (21%). Among women the absolute inequalities in mortality were mostly due to lung cancer and chronic lower respiratory tract diseases (30%) and CVD (27%).

Inequality was greater among men and peaked in early childhood and at age 40–49 years. The proportion of deaths attributable to inequality increased during the study period, particularly for women, because mortality rates among the most deprived women (excluding cardiovascular diseases) plateaued, and for some diseases increased.
