In the inquisitorial system, the judge has a much more active role in directing the case and often makes inquiries, calls and examines witnesses and generally determines the matters that the court will decide.

In contrast, Judges in an inquisitorial legal system tend to be free to make decisions on a case-by-case basis. The principle behind the adversarial legal system is to place distance between the investigation taking place and the person who ultimately decides the outcome.
