The American Prize defines a "wind ensemble/concert band" to be (at minimum) a conducted ensemble of at least 10 instrumentalists, which may be a mixed, all brass or all woodwind ensemble. (This definition is purposely broad to allow the largest number of potential contestants to be eligible.
