Systematic reviews require a careful analysis of the quality, quantity, and consistency of research findings (Moher, Liberati, Tetzlaff, Altman, & The PRISMA Group, 2009; Slocum et al., 2012).The process of initiating a systematic review typically begins with a team of experts who are motivated to answer one of two types of questions.

**Medical research: Systematic review and meta-analysis**

The objective of this systematic review is to assess the efficacy and safety of mirtazapine in the treatment of patients with fibromyalgia. Pubmed (1946-May 2018), Embase (1947-May 2018), CENTRAL, and ClinicalTrials.gov were queried using the search term combination: fibromyalgia, pain, chronic pain, neuralgia, neuropathic pain, chronic widespread pain, or chronic pain syndrome and mirtazapine.
